Artwork Guidelines:

- Creations must be original artwork created by the child
- All physical mediums are acceptable - paints, pencils, collage, sculpture, etc.
- No digitally created or edited art accepted

Judging Criteria:

- Interpretation of the music
- Creativity and originality
- Artistic skill and technique
- Overall impact and visual appeal.

Prizes:

- The winning art will be projected during the concert or featured on the CMSFW social media pages.

Age Categories:

- Rising Artists: Up to 7
- Aspiring Artists: 8-12
- Emerging Artists: 13-18

- Please provide the information below and submit* a digital scan or photograph of your artwork or a photograph of your sculpture to ncostello@cmsfw.org, CMSFW Education Director, by January 4, 2025. Winners will be announced before the concert on January 18, 2025. The concert will be on Saturday, January 25, 2025 at 11am at the Kimbell Art Museum.

Tips For Submitting

- Image Quality - ensure the image is high-resolution
- File Format: PNG or JPEG will work best. Other formats may show a reduction in quality in the final publication
- Editing: No digital edits, filters, etc are allowed. Digitally altered submissions will not be accepted

Music: Listen to any version you prefer of Mussorgsky's Pictures at an Exhibition. The original work was composed for piano. The most widely-known version for orchestra was composed by French composer Maurice Ravel. Many arrangements of the work exist. You are welcome to choose your favorite one.

The piece has five "Promenades", or interludes, between the main movements. You may be inspired to create one original work based on the idea of *all* of the promenades walking through a museum. If you choose to create your artwork based on one specific promenade, please indicate the number (see below).
